## How Europe uses money to help people work

Europe wants everyone to have a fair chance to work and live well.

To make this happen, Europe has special programmes that give money to different kinds of help.

These programmes can really make a difference in people's lives.

For example:

- The **European Social Fund Plus** helps people have equal chances to get a job and have a good life.
- The **Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values Programme** supports equal rights and respect for everyone.
- The **Recovery and Resilience Facility** supports people in periods of crisis.
- The **European Regional Development Fund** helps people in poorer places in Europe to study, work and have a better life.
- The **Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund** helps people who move to Europe from other countries to start a new life.



## What Europe should do next

To help everyone work and feel included, Europe should make these programmes even stronger. It should spend a good part of its money to make sure all people have fair chances to work and have a good life.

Europe should use the programmes we talked about before to:

- Give support to people who look after their children or other family members to be able to work.
- Give training to people to learn new skills and keep their jobs. For example, teach older people how to use technology like computers at their work.
- Help mothers to find jobs.
- Help people who move to Europe to find jobs and take part in the community.
